CTSA Systems

▶ **CTSA Web - Public**

- Provides CTSA Consortium information to multiple audiences, e.g., general public, Congress, advocacy groups, and researchers (CTSA / non-CTSA)
- Provides access to CTSA Consortium news, events, and CTSA committee information

▶ **CTSA Wiki – CTSA Consortium (login)**

- Provides a collaboration forum allowing CTSA institution participation through collaborative workspace, online discussion, document management, etc.
- Provides an information sharing forum for consortium specific communications including centralized calendar, meeting specifics, etc.

▶ **CTSA Management System - NIH**

- Provides repository for data allowing tracking and reporting needs of CTSA Program
- Provides dynamic feed of data both to ctsaweb.org website and to the wiki

Improving Access to the CTSA Wiki

- ▶ **Access the CTSA Wiki provided through one of two ways:**
 - Username and password provided through NIH EXT
 - Government password, subject to full government security parameters
 - Password expires every 60 days
 - When member institution is **federated** with the NIH, institution assigned username and password is used
 - Launched February 18, 2009
 - Significantly reduces burden of access
 - Information available on the Federation Q&A page on CTSAweb.org
 - Consortium federation statics available on the wiki, CTSA Main
